As an educator, Messina Lambert has ongoing contact with numerous children every day. In 2022, she stepped forward and became a relative caregiver for three siblings who she knew through her work in the school system. She has since adopted the three siblings and when their older sibling needed a placement, Messina was willing to provide care for that child as well. Throughout her time as a foster parent, Messina has been a team player with agency personnel. She has been a strong advocate for the youth in her home and works to make sure that each youth's individual needs are being met. Messina has been supportive of visits with birth family members and strives to ensure that all of the siblings are able to maintain contact with one another. Messina also maintains open communication with both caseworkers and licensing workers. The Baby Fold appreciates all Messina has done to assist youth in her home in achieving permanency and for being a great team member. It takes a village, and we are glad Messina is part of ours at The Baby Fold!

REMINDER: The family finding position was created by DCFS to ensure that there is an ongoing expansive search for supports for children in care. Our Family Finding Workers, Dree Carr and Cecelia Steinbacher-Kemp, reach out to all case members every 6 months prior to an Administrative Case Review (ACR) occurring to check in and inquire about resources and supports for the children you foster. As critical member of the child and family team, we want to hear from you as foster parents! The resources you provide can be supportive in a variety of ways, including childcare, respite, emotional support, potential placement options if needed, and much more. We value your input and want to know who supports you because who supports you also supports the child! We know it takes a village!

Don't forget about our Referral Incentive Program!

If you refer a family for licensure that successfully becomes licensed, with a child placed in the home, you will be rewarded \$150! Referred families must identify you within the first 3 days of the licensing process. Please reach out to your licensing worker if you have any questions or concerns.

Foster Parent Rights and Responsibilities #13

Foster Parents have the right to be considered as a placement option when a foster child who was formerly placed with the foster parents is to be re-entered into foster care when such placement would be consistent with the best interest of the child and other children in the purpose of administrative case reviews, client service plans and court processes, as well as any filing or time requirements associated with these proceedings; and the responsibility to actively participate in the foster parent's designated role in these proceedings.
