TBRI® Classrooms is designed to meet the basic relationship and developmental needs of these children within a classroom setting, as well as the needs of the teachers and administrators who seek to help them heal, learn, and grow.

5. Understanding of how to interpret a child's behaviors and respond in a manner that strengthens relationships and facilitates learning.
6. A community based trauma-informed framework for the practical application of TBRI® concepts and strategies across settings.
7. Connections with others within the community who can provide additional support in implementing trauma-informed practices within a school setting.
